

Join a walk with local guides to discover the new Hidden Heritage Trail. There are two starting times from the Three Villages Hall (the latter for those who can't get up too early!) The walk is about 2.5 miles long and follows reasonably good-quality paths. Each walk will break mid-way, near the tarmac drive opposite the bus stop at Ballyhennan Crescent, for snacks and demonstrations of:

- Flint knapping with Dr Dene Wright
- Dry stone dyke repairs with the West of Scotland Dry Stone Dyking Association
- Boat dragging with the Galgael Trust (and any willing volunteers!)
- 'Burnt mounds'; heating water in pre-history with Northlight Heritage
- Ancient dyeing using woad with Northlight Heritage
