Shaline had been approached by Mike Vass about an event called December-Well. To be performed in early December. This would be an afternoon concert but could also provide workshops for children. The group agreed to pursue this.

ArtMap Argyll. Agreed to work in partnership with them. Action Rhona Dick

The Touring Network. Membership would cost us £50 a year for the first two years. There are conditions attached to membership (e.g. attending AGM, actively promoting the scheme and displaying the logo). It was agreed that Shaline should investigate further.

Hidden Heritage Conference 10<sup>th</sup> May. The Coffee Morning will be cancelled that day. Sue Furness to update the website with this and Afternoon Tea with the DCB.

It was agreed that the Youth Club should be asked to cancel on the evening of the Skerryvore concert. The group felt that they should not be offered free tickets or a free evening as this would set a precedent for all other Hall users.

There was discussion about getting information out to people. Ideally there should only be one mailing list so that people only receive one notification. It was agreed that Stephen should have it. Andy Downs uses a list of Trust members. For Data Protection reasons the hall might not be able to access this list or the one Mary Haggarty has. It was agreed that Mary would contact everyone on her list asking for their permission to notify them via the Hall of events. The list could then be passed on to Stephen. Rhona will contact Andy Downs and ask him to do the same.

# i. Website

#### **AOCB**

A donation had been received from the Gala Committee. Retta has written a letter of thanks.

The following Information about dialing 112 has been received from David Burley. Its main function is to provide service on a mobile telephone hand set. These functions are built in to the SIM card it is not provider specific or telephone hand set specific.

- 1: Any mobile handset will carry 112.
- 2: If you are out of range from your service provider it will find the nearest provider's mast.
- 3: If you have to use someone else's mobile in an emergency and it is password protected, dialing 112 will bypass the password and call the emergency operator.
- 4: You can send a text message to 112, this is useful as it uses a different set of frequencies from voice, so if all else fails try sending a text. The emergency service should respond in 3 minutes. Note you have to register for the text message service, send a text message with the word REGISTER to 112/999, they will send back a text message to you, read it and if you are happy, you will be asked to send a message YES to 999, you will then receive another text message confirming that

you mobile is registered.

5: If the mobile telephone you are using is a pay as you go and has no credit, 112 will still work.

There was discussion about the most suitable place to display the Roll of Honour. Some people felt the foyer was too cluttered and the paint colour unsuitable. Sue Furness suggested having a picture rail in the Hall for temporary exhibitions/meetings/courses. The group felt that this could be useful as long as it was clear of the heaters and was not a fire hazard. Sue Furness will get some sample rails.

It was agreed that afternoon meetings are not suitable for everyone and that in future alternate meetings will be held in the evening. As the Hall is fully booked on Wednesday evening meetings will take place on Thursdays. This should enable more people to attend and open the group up to a wider section of the community.

Nothing has been done about recycling bins. It was agreed that one should be placed in the kitchen.

Sue Furness said that the new storage boxes for glasses were very good but she found it difficult to get them out of the cupboard. It was agreed that space should be found in the kitchen.
