A LOCAL group has provided 25 children from war-torn Ukraine "an escape from it all" during a trip to Scot-The Arrochar and Tarbet Com-

munity Development Trust invited the children - many of whom were orphans - to the Three Villages Hall for lunch and a trip on a boat on Loch Lomond.

Dr Maria Jemicz, director of the trust, heard the children were paying a visit to Scotland through friends who are also part of the Ukrainian community in Edinburgh and knew that the trust could help.

She said: "I am a member of the club in Edinburgh as my father was Ukrainian and I like to stay in touch with my roots. I have a summer house over there and I go over
